



## 2017-18 Course Registration

Course registration for school year 2017-18 will take place immediately after our return from winter break: January 3-6, 2017.

Please use the winter break to discuss with your student course options for next school year. Juniors will have discussed these options during their CAP conferences – please look at the academic planner. However, please be aware that the academic planner does not “talk” to course registration. Students still need to log into Infinite Campus and register for courses.

There are many new courses being offered next school year. Students will be introduced to these courses during advisory in December. It is critical that students have a long-term view of what they would like to do senior year (Youth options courses? Knights Construction? Youth apprenticeships?). Many of our programs such as these require pre-requisites and if students plan ahead, they can reach their goals. Without planning, students may be frustrated to find out they cannot participate in the program they were hoping to.

## Student Assistance Program

Winter can be a particularly tough time for some students and families. The Oak Creek Franklin Joint School District provides, free of charge, to students and families in the middle and high schools access to the Aurora Student and Family Assistance Program (ASFAP). The ASFAP provides: counseling for up to 6 sessions per concern, referrals to other agencies for more in-depth treatment, legal, financial, elder care and child support services.

Parents must make the first phone call to 800-236-3231. The parent will initially talk with a counselor by phone. This phone session allows ASFAP to introduce themselves, discuss their services, and to answer any questions the parent may have.
