Street Parking

Show Empathy

Can your teen walk a mile in another person's shoes? Having the ability to empathize with others will make your high schooler less likely to take part in bullying and more likely to respond if a classmate is bullied. Here are ways to develop empathy.

Use news to talk about feelings.

Current events can help him practice putting himself in someone else's place. If tornadoes destroy homes elsewhere in the country, discuss how it would feel to lose your home tin the blink of any eye. If he were in that situation, what would he want others to do?

Use feelings to solve problems.

When conflicts occur, have your teen focus on the feelings behind them. If he and his sister argue, they could take turns using "I statements" to explain how they feel. ("I get frustrated when you close the tabs I had open on the computer.") He'll learn to see things form someone else's point of view.

Use names for feelings.

Talk about emotions so it's easier for him to recognize them. ("I bet you were *disappointed.*" "Do you think you may be *jealous?*") Being aware of his feelings—and naming them—will help him be more sensitive to others' emotions.



Welcome to Oak Creek High School, Home of the Knights!

Happy Fall, Everyone! As we wrap up our 2016 fall sports season and teams head into postseason competition, I am very proud of the effort and dedication put forth by our student-athletes and coaches. Here is a rundown of where our teams were at as of the middle of October.

Boys Soccer is having one of the best seasons in school history. The team went undefeated in SEC play and clinched the conference championship on October 12th with a win over Kenosha Indian Trail. This marks the second conference championship for the program in the past three years. The team will likely earn one of the top seeds in their regional playoff bracket and it should be an exciting playoff run as we close out October!

Girls Tennis capped another strong season at the SEC Championship meet, finishing in third place. Advancing to the WIAA state meet for an incredible third time in her career was senior Kayla Stolz, who teamed with Junior Tori Lara at number 1 doubles to earn the state berth.

Boys and Girls Cross Country participated in the SEC Championship meet on October 15th. Coach Soto had high hopes going in that both teams could finish in the top three and possibly come out as conference champs! After that, the teams will set their sights on qualifying for the state meet in early November.

Girls Volleyball engineered a tremendous turnaround this season and finished in second place in the Southeast Conference with a record of 5-2 in conference play. The team earned a home regional playoff game on Thursday, October 20th vs. South Milwaukee at 7pm.

Boys Volleyball also made a nice jump in the conference standings in year two of the program, finishing in fourth place. The senior led team has been extremely competitive this season, including close losses to some of the top teams in the area. Their playoff seed had not yet been released as of press time.

Girls Golf finished the season on a high note by qualifying as a team for the WIAA sectional meet in only their second year of existence. This was an incredible accomplishment! Junior Alexis Hecker was one of the top players in the conference and finished 11th at the sectional meet, just four strokes shy of qualifying for state. The girls finished in 4th place in the Southeast Conference.

Football went into their final regular season game at Kenosha Indian Trail on October 14th needing a win to qualify for the WIAA playoffs. The team has been a part of some exciting games this season in route to a 5-3 overall record as of press time. We will update you on their finish next month.

Girls Swim and Dive has enjoyed one of their best seasons in recent history, and are 4-2 in SEC dual meets as of press time. Coach Schoen expected several swimmers and divers to qualify for the WIAA state meet in Madison in mid November. We will update you on their record breaking season and state tournament results in November!
